1.	Introductions
	The co-chairs AA and BT introduced themselves and explained their role as a Faculty Rep. The Faculty Reps went over effective methods of feedback Reps can use as well as classifying when an issue was a course issue and when it was a faculty issue.
2.	Updates from Faculty Reps
	The Faculty Reps have been settling into their role and attending meetings such as Faculty Learning and Teaching Committee (FLTQCs) and Board of Studies (BoS). They emphasised the importance of encouraging their cohort to complete the Open Unit Evaluation to gather valuable insight on each module.

3.	Updates from Academic Reps
	The chairs opted to go around the room to have informal chats with each Rep due to the number of Reps attending. The key themes that arose are detailed below.
	3.1. <u>Reading Week</u>
	All departments in the faculty have a reading week, however, when this happens differs for each. For example, Social Policy Sciences have it in week 4 to align with half term for staff, as opposed to Psychology who have it in week 7. There is a strong feeling of needed a more unified approach to reading week.
	3.2. <u>C7 &amp; Exam Questions</u>
	There is a lack of clarity around the essay structure in the Politics and International Studies department. However, this could be brought up in an incoming seminar.
	3.3. <u>Programming Economics (12003)</u>
	Economics Year 1 Reps in attendance shared that the module is "unclear" and that students are unsatisfied with the content as it is the first time this unit has been available to students. AA encouraged them to feed this bad in their OUEs.
