

## **Co-option Guidance**

## 1. Permitted Co-option Period:

- i. Student groups are only permitted to carry out co-options within two weeks following the by-election dates.
- ii. All group members should be allowed to vote.
- iii. Co-options outside this period are not allowed, as they undermine the democratic purpose of elections. The SU will consider co-opting if the role is very much needed due to the activity of the group. The process for this is laid out in the below section.

## 2. Consequences of Unfilled Positions:

- i. If the core committee positions remain vacant beyond the two-week window, the group may be classified as inactive. However, co-options can take place under the following exceptions.
- 3. Exceptions for Co-option Committee Roles:

Co-options may be considered outside the permitted period only under the following circumstances:

- i. A core committee member (Chair or Treasurer) resigns or is otherwise unable to continue in their role.
- ii. If having the position vacant goes against SU policy and co-option is necessary for the effective functioning or continuity of the group.
- iii. In all cases above, the situation must be formally discussed with the Deputy Returning Officer (DRO) before any co-option process can proceed.

## 4. Voting Procedure for Co-options:

- i. Co-option decisions must be made through an online poll open to the members of the relevant group.
- ii. The poll must include:
  - 1. All nominated candidates for the vacant position.
  - 2. A Re-Open Nominations (RON) option to ensure transparency and democratic choice.
