Hall Committee, Hall Reps

Key Responsibilities:

- Work as a team to plan, promote and deliver events for students living in halls, ensuring there are a range of activities to appeal to the diverse student body
- Create a sense of community to improve the student experience of living in halls
- Represent students in your hall and act as a point of contact between them, the SU and the University
- Collect feedback on issues and represent your area at a Hall Forum twice a semester (Lead Rep only)

Structure: The accommodation blocks around campus and in the city are split into halls areas. Each area has a team of 5 Hall Reps elected to represent the views of the students they live with and run events and activities to help build the halls community. Once elected, one rep is nominated to be the Lead Hall Rep of that team.

Time Commitment:

- Hall Committees are in place for one academic year.
- Usually around 1 hour per week with extra time at busy periods (e.g events and meetings)
- Attendance at training
- Attendance at regular Committee meetings
- Attendance at monthly Hall Forum (Lead Rep only)
- There will be an opportunity to become a Hall Committee Mentor in your 2nd year.
- **Responsible to:** SU Community Coordinator
