## Peer Mentoring

All first-year students are allocated a Peer Mentor who is there to support you throughout your first year. Your Peer Mentor will be studying the same, or similar course to yourself. They can share their experience of student life to help you feel settled and enjoy your time at university. Peer Mentors can support you with many different aspects of student life, including:

- · How to get involved in societies, activities, and University life.
- How to study and useful tips about your course.
- · Where to go and explore in Bath.
- · Where to find placements, voluntary or paid work opportunities.
- Advice on how to find a house, prepare for an exam, choose units or apply to study abroad.

Even if a mentor is unable to help you with a specific problem or question, they will be able to signpost to a person or service that can help.

## What happens next?

- 1. Your mentor will send you an email at the start of the year.
- 2. You are likely to have an online group meeting with your mentor and their mentees.
- 3. Your peer mentor will check in regularly, and you can ask them any questions at any point throughout your first year.

If your mentor has not responded or you would like a different mentor, you can contact your department or the Peer Support team who will ensure you are matched with a different peer mentor.
