### Professor Ian Jamieson OBE (Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees)



Professor Ian Jamieson, retired as Pro Vice Chancellor, Learning and Teaching at the University of Bath in December 2009. As Pro Vice Chancellor he was responsible for all aspects of the student experience, working very closely with the Students' Union.

Ian joined the University of Bath in 1985. He was promoted directly from lecturer to a personal chair (the only time the University has done this) and soon became a head of department and then Dean.

More broadly Professor Jamieson has an established reputation in the field of vocational education. He founded and edited the Journal of Education and Work for 13 years – now the leading international journal in the field and has over 80 publications and five books to his name. In the early 1980s Ian co-directed the Industry Project, in which most work-related activities in schools today have their origins.

More recently, he has worked very closely with secondary schools in Swindon and has been a School Governor for many years.

As a consequence of the high regard in which he is held, Ian has chaired or served on a wide range of local, regional and national committees.
