## How groups will be rated

The panel will mark submission based on the criteria and give a rating as seen below.

To get a star rating you need to get the minimum points for that rating AND achievements in certain categories. For example:

- If you score 3 points in Food and 3 points in Campaigns you will have 6 points but will need an additional 3 points from other categories to gain 4 Stars.
- If you gain 2 points in Food, Clothing, Campaigns, Awareness and Skills you will have 10 points but will be awarded 3 Stars as you haven't achieved "at least 3 points in 2 categories"
